

Ancaster Fair Celebrates 160 Years

Wow! 160 years is a long time for the Ancaster Fair to exist. The length of Agricultural Fairs in Ontario and Ancaster Fair is proof of how important farming has been, and still is. A fair is basically a contest between farmers to find out who has the best crops, the most productive animals, and even the best household products, including baking and needle work. This year's fair has hundred of entries in several different categories.

The result of the contests over the past centuries has resulted in the improvement in the quality of the products produced by rural businesses. We have better crops, better vegetables, better fruit, better meat products and better baking as a result of the Agricultural Fairs.

Visitors to the Fair will be able to see hundreds of judged items on display and view the cattle, horses, sheep, rabbits and goats in competition. As an example of the numbers of species involved, there are 65 species of potted plants, 49 species of Garden Vegetables, 28 varieties of Grain and Seed and scores of other varieties to view.
