Happy Summer everyone.... I trust everyone is enjoying the summer of 2013 and all the fairs that have happened or about to commence in the coming two months.

I would like to advise everyone that the Board is currently performing a comprehensive review of Governance and Finances to ensure the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies has the appropriate Governance Model and a Sustainable financial future.

The OAAS and Agricultural Societies have enriched rural and urban Ontario for over 200 years. This is amazing considering that Canada will not be 150 years young until 2017.

The Province of Ontario has evolved during the past 150 years and so has the OAAS and Agricultural Societies.

We are about to write the next chapter in the history of the OAAS and during this process of renewal we will honour our past, engage in the present and have faith in the future. We value everyone's input during this process and look at building trust and open honest respectful dialogue.

Since hiring our new GM Mark numerous initiatives have commenced and overall the feedback has been very positive. Over the past few months the executive, Strategic Planning and Finance Committees have been working on a strategy for Sustainability hence the following has been approved.

- 1. Governance Review Team: Helen Scutt from OMAFRA has agreed to be the team's advisor and resource. GM Mark will not be participating on this team as he is a paid employee. The purpose of the Review Team will be to investigate different Governance models survey directors, contact members, stakeholders and other groups that have undergone Governance Reviews. The goal of Governance Review Team is to prepare a draft governance document with options for executive review on or before Sept 20th. A Governance Review recommendation will be presented at the Fall board meeting. Once a consensus is reached at the Fall Board meeting then a plan on how to communicate to members at AGM 2014 will be developed. After convention February 2014 and for the months preceding Convention 2015 executive and directors will be talking to Agricultural Societies and stakeholders about our vision for the future. If consensus is reached then a Resolution will be approved at the October 2014 Board meeting with members voting at the 2015 AGM.
- 2. Finance Committee: The Finance Committee under the leadership of Mark will commence a comprehensive review of income and expenses. The Finance Committee will develop several financial models of sustainability. The committee will be contacting numerous Agricultural Societies and stakeholders for their input during the review process. The draft sustainable document with financial model options is due for executive review September 20th. The same steps will be followed as the Governance Review Team since both Governance and Sustainability are connected.

I appreciate everyone's passion, dedication and engagement during this time of renewal and in writing the next chapter of our history. If anyone has any guestions or concerns please contact me.

WINNER – 1st Place OAAS 60% Whole Wheat Bread - Sharon Legge, Chesley Fair - District 10

In a small bowl put: 1c warm water, 1tsp sugar. Sprinkle over this 2 pkg of yeast and let stand for 10 minutes

In a very large bowl combine: 3 cups hot water, 2tbsp honey, 2tbsp molasses, 1 tbsp of salt, ½ cup vegetable oil, 2tbsp lemon juice. Then stir in dissolved yeast.

Add 2 cups of whole wheat flour and 2 cups all-purpose flour. Beat until smooth.

Stir in 4 cups of whole wheat flour and 2 cups of all-purpose flour (add one cup at a time). Gradually add enough whole wheat flour to form a dough ball (maybe 1-2 cups more)

Turn onto flour surface & knead 5-10 minutes or until smooth & elastic

Put dough into a big greased bowl, turning to coat all surfaces

Cover and set in warm place to rise until doubled (about 1-1 ½ hours)

Punch down

Form into loaves- put into bread pans & let rise until doubled again.

Bake at 375 deg. for 30-35 minutes

Remove from pans & allow to cool. Yield 4 loaves.

First Safe Strides Is Here To Help Horse Show Organizers

If you are director, volunteer, show manager or otherwise involved in running horse shows at agricultural society fairs, the Ontario Equestrian Federation has a new program to assist you in hosting a successful show.

What is First Safe Strides?

The First Safe Strides program is designed to support agricultural societies as they design and implement safe horse shows. We want to be a resource for horse show organizers and assist them in developing competitions that adhere to standard safety and procedural requirements.

Who is the Ontario Equestrian Federation?

The OEF represents 22,000 individual members who come from all sectors of the horse industry. Our membership base includes professionals, amateurs, competitors and recreational enthusiasts of all ages and disciplines.

Why is it important that we work together?

Equine events such as horse shows are an important part of the agricultural component of a fair and help support their community. Grassroots horse shows, like those held at Ontario's fairs, provide an affordable, welcoming environment for novice exhibitors. These exhibitors need to be fostered in a positive learning environment so our entire industry can strengthen and grow.

How can the OEF help you?

The OEF representative will be travelling for the duration of the fair season to attend horse shows and make connections with the hardworking directors and volunteers who make them possible. We can provide on-site membership applications for exhibitors arriving without liability coverage and work with horse show organizers to ensure OEF memberships presented by exhibitors are current.

We also strive to educate the public about equine events and how they can get involved in the horse industry. To that end, we provide free educational material, such as our *Guide for New Riders*,.

After the event, we can provide a comprehensive evaluation of key areas that can affect the success of a horse show,.

There are also a number of OEF programs available for agricultural societies to take advantage of. Your First Safe Strides representative would be pleased to discuss these options with you. Programs include:


