### **Agricultural Society Annual Return & Grant**

Forms are due February 1st 2013

### **INTERESTING FACTS:**

- To maintain corporate legal status all agricultural societies in Ontario must file an annual return with OMAFRA.
- Annual return includes statement of the number of society members, a list of officers and directors for the incoming year & an audited financial statements.
- To receive a grant your agricultural society must complete all required forms. All grants are paid based on society eligibility and are a reimbursement of eligible expenditures.
- All societies must submit forms by February 1st, 2013.
- Forms must be sent to the designated OMAFRA offices or completed online.

FORMS WILL BE AVAILABLE BY NOVEMBER 15<sup>th</sup> AND CAN BE COMPLETED ONLINE.
