Forms are due February 1st 2015

INTERESTING FACTS:

- To maintain corporate legal status all agricultural societies in Ontario must file an annual return with OMAFRA.
- Annual return includes statement of the number of society members, a list of officers and directors for the incoming year & an audited financial statements.
- To receive a grant your agricultural society must complete all required forms. All grants are paid based on society eligibility and are a reimbursement of eligible expenditures.
- All societies must submit forms by February 1st, 2015.
- Forms must be sent to the designated OMAFRA offices or completed online.
